

RVers can browse for site

Help is available for snowbirds looking for last minute accommodations in campgrounds and RV parks

For most retirees who plan to spend all or part of the winter in Sunbelt campgrounds, RV parks and resorts have already made their reservations. But for those who have waited to the last minute, the task of locating a private park that still has room for short or long-term winter visitors just got a little easier.

Working with its state affiliates, the National Association of RV Parks and Campgrounds has assembled a list of parks that still have room for snowbirds.

“We think this will make it a little easier for snowbirds who are just now heading south to pinpoint parks that still have room for extended stays,” says Linda Profaizer, president and CEO of the association, whose website, Go-CampingAmerica.com, contains detailed information on campgrounds, RV parks and resorts across the country.

As of early January, at least 53 campgrounds, RV parks and resorts in California, Arizona, Texas and Florida had yet to fill up for the season.
